Building community links

- Development for programme was initiated in 2019.
- Need and opportunity had been identified by schools and communities, particularly Far North – shortage of primary school teachers, attracting and maintaining teachers in rural areas.
- Providing an alternative pathway into teaching.
- Far North REAP had an ongoing relationship with Te Rito Maioha focused on ECE.
- They had seen the need to develop primary school teachers from within their communities.
